

Pupil Premium Report

For the year 2014-2015, Canon Pyon CE Academy was allocated £17,800 for children in receipt of Pupil Premium. This was allocated and evaluated as follows:

Initiatives in 2014-15	Evaluation	Action
Subsidised school trips	Children have been able to access extra-curricular activities alongside their peers – something they may not have been able to do without the financial subsidy. Learning has been enhanced as a result of the educational visits and the swimming lessons have enabled children to develop safe play skills around water.	To continue during 2015/16.
Purchase of iPads	iPads have enabled enhancement of learning and offered alternatives to recording of work. This has been particularly useful for children for whom access to modern technology at home has been problematic.	Use of iPads to continue. No further purchases required at this time.
TA support and intervention groups	TA support enables children to access all areas of the curriculum regardless of their level of ability. Our Learning Mentor has also been involved with two of the children and she has been able to offer support with self-esteem and anxiety issues. This has led to a marked improvement in the children’s ability to enjoy and achieve within all areas of the curriculum.	Fewer intervention groups are in place due to changing needs of children. Classroom support to continue.
Forest School Programme: training and provision	Children have gained in confidence and are more able to persevere with tasks they have previously found challenging. They have developed skills of working as part of a team, decision-making, sharing with others and using their initiative. These skills are also being transferred to more academic subjects.	No further training required but provision to continue.

For the year 2015/16, the school was allocated £10, 420 for children in Additional initiatives for 2015/16. In addition to the action points mentioned above, the school has also allocated the funding towards the following initiatives.

- *Talk for Writing: training and provision*
- *THRASS: training, provision and resources*
- *Family Support Worker: employed across the Federation with specific responsibility for CAF assessments*
